Lincoln Water System's Drought Resiliency and Flood Protection Project

Project progress

- o All work under the original grant award agreement was completed in 2020.
- Reimbursement claims (Claim 7) made during this period totaled \$1,087,343.28. Total reimbursement to date is \$6,711,709,78.
- The City of Lincoln's request to utilize unspent funds to continue similar flood protection measures as described in the original grant award was approved by the Commission at the October 28, 2020 meeting.
 - This work was completed in March 2021.
 - Following the approval to use unspent funds, the City was informed that FEMA may consider the additional flood proofing measures under their Public Assistance funding program. While this is not typical of FEMA's PA funding, the City believes it is prudent to first explore this potential funding opportunity before utilizing WSF funds. Final determination on FEMA PA funding may take an extended period of time lasting through 2021. FEMA and State PA funding pay up to 87.5% of the total cost of the project.
- Project related activities planned for the coming year.
 - Determination of FEMA PA funding available for flood proofing.
- Forecasted or projected (estimated) cash flow for remainder of the project.
